The Bee Barn Project

I just wanted to tell you about <u>The Bee Barn Project</u> - an exciting project our Eco Club have **bee**n chosen to take part in. Kettering Nature Group have selected a small number of sites across Kettering to house one of their Bee Barns - a home for solitary bees to lay their eggs in. Our job is to study the nesting **bee**haviour of the bees and report our findings back to the group. We have **bee**n provided with some wildflower seeds to **bee** planted around school.

The Barn will **bee** placed on the wall **beehind** the vegetable patch.

I know there have **bee**n some concerns regarding the safety of the project. I want to alleviate these by telling you we are not introducing any more bees to the local area. We are merely providing a home for those already here. Also, male solitary bees have no sting. We currently have no known children in school with an allergy to stings. If this changes, the situation will be risk assessed accordingly.

If there are any questions, please let me know. I will be doing an assembly in the near future to let the children know all about it.

PARKING UPDATE

We continue to discuss and monitor the parking situation with Hanwood Park. The latest update is that there are set to be some alterations to the yellow lining; introducing areas where waiting times will be permitted to 30 minutes. This will obviously increase the available parking areas ahead of the introduction of any penalty system. These are expected around mid-May whilst the Homerun collects your feedback (please do share your views) and safety assessments of routes to school are completed. Hanwood Park still reserves the right to penalise those who park dangerously, which would include parking on any zig-zags and the junction of Ayrton Close. There has been ample notice of these danger points so there really are no excuses.
